Happenings at Drumright High school one hundred years ago. The Drumright High School Class of 1923 graduated in the auditorium of the new high school on Pennsylvania Street. There were 34 students in the class of 1923, 23 girls and just 11 boys. Of course, during those years, boys were quitting school and going out to work in the oilfields, as jobs were plentiful. The young men that remained and completed high school were either academically minded and going off to college or going to work in the family business right after graduation.

Here are some specifics on the class of 1923. The class flower was the daisy. The class colors were orange and white. And the class

motto was, "Make a life, not a living." Class officers wereThe Drumright High School Faculty was composed of 30 individuals. Mr. W. C. French was the Superintendent of Schools. Miss Floy V. Elliott was the Principal. Interestingly, 20 of the staff were female. The classes available for high school students included English, English Literature, Modern Languages, Civics, Hygiene, Chemistry, Manual Training, Dramatics, American History, World History, Geometry, Latin, Mechanical Drawing, Biology, Physics, Music, Domestic Science and Domestic Arts.

Athletic programs were abundant during the 1922-1923 term. The football team played 11 games, and

had a record of 7 wins, 3 losses and 1 tie. But 6 of those 7 wins were shutouts, where the opponents were held scoreless. The boys' basketball record was not so stellar with 7 wins and 7 losses. The girls' basketball team, however, finished with a record of 6 wins and 1 loss, losing their final game by only 3 points. The boys also had a baseball team and track team, but no records were available.

All of the above information came from the 1923 Drumright High School Gusher. Down at the depot, we have copies of the Drumright yearbooks from 1915 all the way up to 2015. These yearbooks are a wealth of information, photographs and history. If anyone has any yearbooks from 2016 to the resent, the museum would love to have them, as they are wonderful reference material for historians and genealogists. Plus, if you just want to have some fun, come on down to the museum and take a look around!




