DOWN AT THE DEPOT

There are marvelous collections of all kinds of things down at the depot. This past week, I came across a collection of old photographs from the 1920s and 1930s.

These pictures are mostly of children....happy, smiling, oil patch kids, growing up on oil leases, running around in the dirt, living carefree lives. These photos were taken by Lee T. Dunn. He was an early day photographer in the Drumright area. But primarily, he was a pumper for the Prairie Oil Company and later the Sinclair Oil Company from the early 1920s through the 1940s.

We believe his family came from Caney, Kansas to the Indian Territory before Oklahoma statehood in 1907. Around 1912, his older sister's family moved

to the Drumright area. His sister was Jessie Dunn and she was married to Freeman Shaw. Jessie and Freeman had two children, Abby Ann and Glenn Curtis Shaw. Abby Ann married Fildy Tarr from Cushing in 1920. Glenn married Bertha Billings in 1924 in Cushing.

Lee T. Dunn was a family man. Lee's family consisted of his wife, Albie, and their five children, Harvey, Jimmy, twin girls – June and Joan, and the baby, Ruby. He enjoyed capturing candid shots of his wife and children doing ordinary everyday things. It is Ruby Dunn Hood that gifted this collection of family photos to our museum.

It was a hard life living on an oil lease, south of Drumright. But the Dunn family made the best of it.They played together and took joy in just being with each other. You can see from these photos that Lee Dunn enjoyed his family immensely. Since a picture is worth a thousand words, I'll let the pictures tell the story.







Cremation and funeral arrangements were entrusted to the care of Michael's Funeral Home of Drumright.




Richard Wayne Dorsey
