With Veterans' Day approaching and threats of war in the Middle East again, it seems fitting to revisit our Military Room, down at the depot. At this museum, we have an entire room dedicated to preserving the artifacts and the memories of our local heroes that served proudly in the military forces of the United States. You may remember some of their stories.

John W. Smalley came to Oklahoma as a young man, seeking adventure during the early oil boom days. He was working as a mechanic in the old fields, when the U.S. entered into World War I in April of 1917. He enlisted in the U.S. Army and was shipped overseas to fight in Europe. He was attached to the Ninetieth

Division. Sadly, Sgt. Smalley was killed in action
September 12, 1918, near
Vileey, France. This was the first day of the Battle of St.
Mihiel. He had bravely fought and was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism in action. Sgt. Smalley was also awarded the Purple Heart.

Raymond E. Camden was a member of the Drumright High Class of 1940. After high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy. Raymond was a Seaman, Second Class, serving aboard the U.S.S. Arizona in 1941. This battleship was stationed at Pearl Harbor, just off the island of Oahu, in the U.S. Territory of the Hawaiian Islands. On December 7,

1941, the Japanese launched a torpedo attack on the ships in Pearl Harbor. Japanese bomber pilots bombed the U.S.S. Arizona as well. The battleship sank into the harbor with 1,177 individuals aboard. Over 900 sailors were unrecovered. Raymond Camden is still onboard that ship and became the first Drumright serviceman to die during World War II. Barely 19 years old, he paid the ultimate sacrifice. His photo and Purple Heart are displayed proudly in our museum.

Drumright's military history is not complete without the story of Lester Carl Byard who served nearly four years as a prisoner of war during World War II. There are two large scrapbooks his family donated to the museum. Lester would have graduated with the class of 1940, but he guit school and enlisted in the U.S. Marines on January 12, 1940. Lester served as a Private First Class with the First Defense Battalion (an anti-aircraft battery) on Wake Island. This is where he was stationed when the island was attacked by the Japanese on December 7, 1941. The Battle of Wake Island coincided with the attack on Pearl Harbor. The Marines fought valiantly for two weeks, but Wake Island fell to the Empire of Japan on December 23, 1941. Over 1,600 military and civilian personnel were taken as prisoners. For four long months, his family struggled to

receive any information regarding Lester. Finally, they received word that he was a POW, being held in Shanghai, China. Two years later, he was moved to a prison camp in Osaka, Japan, where he endured horrible living and working conditions. Finally, on September 7, 1945, he was released and sent to California to recover at a naval hospital. Every letter, telegram and newspaper clipping were kept by his family, and are included in these scrapbooks.

Billy Hewitt was the first Drumright person to die while serving in the military during the Vietnam War. His greatest ambition was to become the best Marine he could be. The Vietnam War was raging overseas. By 1965, Billy had attained the rank of Sergeant. He was on active duty, fighting in the Danang Province of Vietnam, when he was killed by enemy fire. He died on July 6, 1966, just six days short of his twenty-first birthday. He was buried with full military honors at Ft. Gibson National Cemetery. He was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart for his heroic service.

There are more stories to be viewed in our military room. We have uniforms, swords, flags, medals, scrapbooks and more on display. Drumright does not lack for military heroes. Just

come take a look and honor those who have protected our country.

The Elerick Legacy:

A significant hiring for Drumright was Chris Elerick, the son of Phil Elerick. Phil Elerick was a remarkable football coach in his own right, having won two State Titles at Cashion. In 1979, Elerick's football team secured a victory over Lone Wolf with a score of 17-14. They also triumphed over OCS (28-22), Waynoka (34-6), and Blue Jack (57-20). In 1981, they defeated OCS in the final match with a score of 44-14. Their successful run also included wins against Helena Goltry (48-14), Shidler (42-12), and Parnell (26-6). The state finals that year were held in Cushing, a memorable experience. Although Phil coached at Drumright with a record of 9-11, his imagination was unparalleled.

The Swinging Gate Play:

When Drumright faced a challenging opponent like Hominy, Phil ran the swinging gate play, typically used for extra points. He implemented it for an entire half, which was exciting to watch. It caught Hominy off guard as they scrambled to adjust, and though Drumright lost 58-40, the outcome could have been worse considering the talent the Buck had. Phil imparted the wisdom that "One coach will run a play, and the next play, the other coach will counter it."

Chris Elerick's Journey:

Chris Elerick had his coaching stint at Yale, where he managed to turn around an average program. He reached the State semi-finals three times. In 2001, Yale triumphed against Oaks (42-0) in the first round and Tipton (18-14) but fell to Medford. In 2003, Yale outperformed Central Sallisaw (38-6) but lost to Alex in the second round. In 2004, they managed wins against Dibble (42-32) and Foyil (36-6) before succumbing to Morrison in the Semi Finals. His next coaching venture was at Stroud.

Success at Stroud:

In 2007, Stroud secured a win against Foyil (36-6) before losing by a single point to Washington, Oklahoma in 2008. Stroud reached the state finals in 2009 but lost by a single point, 7-8, to the powerful Tonkawa at Lewis Field in Stillwater. Their journey included victories over Savanna (54-6), Pawnee (21-13), Cashion (52-7), and OBA. They made the playoffs many times in 2A after moving up from Class A. Chris's sons, Drew and Grant, also achieved significant success in their careers at Stroud.

Current Success:

Chris is experiencing substantial success at Drumright this year with an 8-0 record. If Drumright can beat 7-1 Barnsdall at Barnsdall on Friday, the Drumright Tornadoes will secure their first District title since 1964.
